# A message from Miss Cooke

This will be our last newsletter of 2024.

As we approach the end of the Autumn term, it is a great time to reflect on all the events, and highlights of the term.

Clear highlights of the term are all the brilliant Christmas productions that the children have performed over the past 2 weeks. All the hard work that the children, supported by the amazing school staff, have put in to each of the performances is wonderful. It has been so rewarding to see the huge smiles from all parents and family members who have attended one or more performances. Thank you to all who have attended.

Another highlight of the year is the visit from Theatre of the Widdershins. This year Andy brought his unique skills, storytelling ability and puppets to share the Tales of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and the Three Little Pigs with the children on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> December. This treat for the children is paid for by the Friends of Edith Cavell from monies raised at the school disco and Christmas fair, so thank you to all parents who supported these events.

We have consulted parents about possible changes to a couple services that we currently provide. Starting from Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2025, we are extending the opening hours of After School Club. After School Club will now be available until 6pm for children in Reception up to Year 6. (unfortunately, we are unable to offer wraparound care to preschool children) Bookings should be made via ParentPay, in advance, to benefit from reduced fees.

We are also consulting parents about the possibility of extending our Preschool, Little Treasures provision to an all-day session, 8.45am – 3.30pm. If we receive positive responses to our consultation, it is likely that all day preschool sessions will be offered from April 2025. If you would like more details about places in our Little Treasures Preschool class, please contact the school office.

We have had significant child and staff sickness since October half term all across the school, so I sincerely hope that the Christmas holidays are an opportunity for the whole school community to rest, get well and recharge their batteries. While children should not attend school if they are unwell, attendance at school is a high priority for the government, local authority and school. In the new year, we will be displaying each classes attendance on their classroom door, each week, so parents can see the level of attendance in their child's class each week.

Even if your child is unwell at any point over the final 12 days of term, their attendance is still important, so once well, please ensure that they return to school.

We will also use the school text service to keep you updated on the situation so please ensure that we hold a current mobile phone number for you, especially if you are fortunate enough to receive a gift of a new mobile phone from Santa!!

If the school is forced to close due to snow, we will do all we can to move to online learning immediately.

#### **Google Classroom**



Over the Covid lockdowns, we developed the use of Google Classroom to deliver remote learning. Please ensure that children in Key Stage 2 are able to access their school email account and therefore their Google Classroom.

Should the weather in Bedford deteriorate and we have a large amount of snow which means that it is not safe for children and staff to come into school, we will move to online remote learning via Google Classroom.

Please check that previously used accounts still work, before they are needed. If your child is new to the school or in Key Stage 1 they will be issued with their log on to their Google accounts. If any parents have a problem supporting their child to access their Google account, please contact your child's class teacher for support.

#### Naming school uniform

Please can we ask parents to check their child's school uniform for a label with their name. If you wrote their name in at the start of the school year there is a very fair chance that it has washed out over the term and if the children take their jumpers off for any reason it can be difficult to get them back to the right person if they are not named. If children are starting to wear hats, scarves and gloves, please also name these as they are extremely difficult to return to their owners unless named.
