Message from Miss Cooke

Thank you to the parents that attended the recent Parent Consultations and Parent Showcases. It is lovely for the children to be able to share their books with their parents and demonstrate how proud they are of their learning. We will be organising Parent Consultations and Showcases again next term.

We have had a considerable amount of pupil and staff sickness throughout November. It has been necessary to send home many children from school because they are unwell in one way or another. We do follow the NHS guidelines on recovery times. If a child has been sick or suffering with diarrhoea, they should not return to school until 48 hours after their last bout of illness. This is to prevent the spread of highly contagious germs and protect all members of the school community. We respectfully request that all parents observe this time scale and do not try to send their child back to school too soon.

When your child is going to be absent from school, all parents should contact the school either via telephone or email to inform us of the reason for absence. If we do not receive an explanation for your child's absence then this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

We are coming into a very busy period in school with many different events that parents can attend in school. We look forward to welcoming as many of you as possible at the different events. If a parent can't attend due to work commitments, we are always very happy to see grandparents or different family members coming to support the children. Please note if it is a grandparent or other family member is attending the school event, they will not be able to take the child home, unless parents have given specific permission by speaking to the class teacher or office **before** the event.

We ask that all adults that are attending performances are **PROMPT**. If adults are coming in late, it disrupts the performance and also distresses the children if they can't see an adult they thought was coming to see their performance. All start times are outlined in the section later in the newsletter.

Slade Walk - Pedestrian Zone

I have been asked by the head teacher at Livingstone Primary School, Mr Thornes, to remind all parents of children at Edith Cavell that at school pick up and drop off times, Slade Walk is a vehicle free, pedestrian zone. No parent vehicles all allowed to drive up Slade Walk. This is for the safety and protection of all the children, families and staff that attend both Edith Cavell and Livingstone Primary Schools.

Parking on Knellor Close and Raynolds Close

School has continued to receive complaints from residents who live in Knellor Close, rightly complaining, about the unacceptable actions of drivers, taxi drivers and parents who are using Knellor Close particularly to drop off children, park to drop off and collect children from Edith Cavell.

When Bedford Borough Parking Control Officers or Miss Cooke are out on Knellor Close, drivers will observe the rules of the Highway code, not block residents drives or park in NO PARKING areas. When Parking Control Officers or Miss Cooke are not present, some drivers think that it is OK to ignore NO PARKING markings – this is putting everyone at risk. The road users, pedestrians



and local residents. If residents cannot get out of their drive and along the road if there is a medical emergency, or an emergency vehicle can not get along the road, someone's life could be at risk. PLEASE will all parents and carers observe the Highway Code, park correctly and not block driveways AT ALL TIMES.

Advice from DfE and NHS

As expected in the winter months, seasonal illnesses are circulating and to support parents, the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has published <u>advice</u> on how to reduce their spread.



Schools should continue maintaining high attendance expectations and refer parents to NHS <u>guidance</u> to know when a child is too ill for school. Pupils should not miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend school with a cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea and vomiting.

Christmas Tree Festival



As a school we have entered the St Paul's Church in Bedford annual Christmas Tree Festival.

This year the school will again be decorating a Christmas Tree for the festival. Children across the school produce decorations around a theme that are displayed on the tree.

Keeping Children Safe On Line

Roblox Major Safety Updates.

Last week Roblox, the game used by 90 million people daily, announced some major updates which are available to users and parents. The rollout has already started and will be fully implemented by March 2025. These safety updates include:

- Limits to how children under 13 can communicate.
- Parental controls accessible from the parents phone rather from the child's device (remote management). There's too much detail to include within this newsletter so to see an explanation of all the new features visit the Roblox website **HERE**.


